SPECIAL ORDINANCE NO. S-_____

AN ORDINANCE of the Common Council fixing, establishing and ratifying compensation for certain City employees represented by The Fraternal Order Police, Indiana Wayne Lodge #14, Inc.

WHEREAS, Common Council previously passed Special Ordinance No.S-130-09 approving the collective bargaining agreement for employees of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, represented by The Fraternal Order Police, Indiana Wayne Lodge #14, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, said agreement is for three (3) years, but pursuant to Indiana law, the compensation provided for therein must be annually ratified; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is necessary to ratify, fix and establish such compensation increased by one percent (1%) for the year 2011 (retroactive to January 1, 2011) for said employees of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana represented by The Fraternal Order Police, Indiana Wayne Lodge #14, Inc..

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

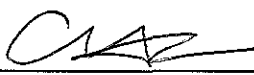

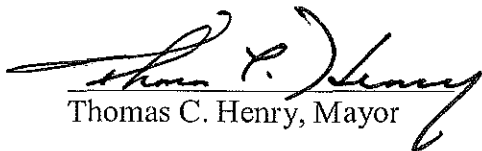

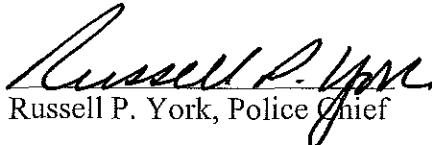

The annual base salary of Sergeants and Lieutenants shall be increased by one (1) percent retroactive to January 1, 2011.

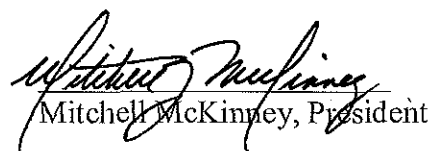

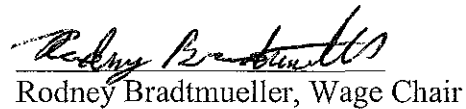

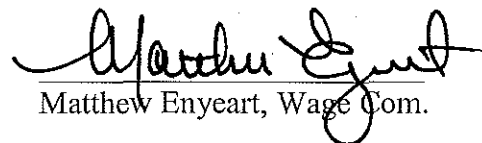
