AN ORDINANCE approving FAIRFIELD AVENUE STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENT PROJECT; RESOLUTION #51083, W.O. #51083 between CITY LIGHTS & SIGNALS and the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, in connection with the Board of Public Works.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the FAIRFIELD AVENUE STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENT PROJECT; RESOLUTION #51083, W.O. #51083 by and between CITY LIGHTS & SIGNALS and the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, in connection with the Board of Public Works; is hereby ratified, and affirmed and approved in all respects, respectfully for:

All labor, insurance, material, equipment, tools, power, transportation, miscellaneous equipment, etc., necessary for The Fairfield Avenue Lighting Improvement project for new historic "Acorn" style street lights between Rudisill Boulevard and Rose Lane (near former Duemling Clinic property) and will include the following:

- Removal of 17 existing high pressure sodium fixtures, 11 wood poles, 10 overhead span wires, and 8 existing fiberglass poles.
- Installation of 48 new ornamental fiberglass poles and "acorn" style LED fixtures. 40 of the new light assemblies will be placed on new concrete bases with new underground wire, and 8 new fixtures will utilize existing concrete bases and existing underground wire.
- Installation of 4 new "Cobra" LED fixtures placed on existing aluminum or wood poles at selected intersections.
- Installation of 5,000 lineal feet of new underground wire in protective bore tube.
- Installation of 4 new electrical service points.

involving a total cost of TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED EIGHT-FIVE AND 00/100 DOLLARS - (\$223,285.00). A copy said Contract is on file with the Office of the City Clerk and made available for public inspection, according to law.

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## **GENERAL NOTES**

UNDERGROUND UTILITIES ARE KNOWN TO EXIST WITHIN THE PROJECT LIMITS. SOME UTILITIES HAVE BEEN NOTED ON THE PLAN SHEETS, AS WERE AVAILABLE AFTER INTIAL LOCATES COMPLETED.

PLAN SHEETS DO NOT SHOW ENTIRE LIMITS OF BURIED UTILITIES. CONTRACTOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR REQUESTING LOCATES FROM ANY AND ALL UTILITY LOCATING SERVICES PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION.

Multi compression fittings shall be of the correct size for each conductor, and of the brand and type specified or approved. All connections in handhole shall be waterproof.

No separate payment shall be made for restoration, unless otherwise noted. All seeding and sod placement shall be included in costs of various pay items.

All work shall be completed per City of Fort Wayne Standard Details, Specifications, and Special Provisions.

Traffic Engineering shall assist with layout of light poles, handholes, and concrete removal.

Underground utilities are located within the project limits. Contractor shall call for utility locates and report all conflicts in writing to Traffic Engineering before commencing work.

No earth or spoil backfill shall be allowed. All backfilling to be completed with compacted granular material and shall be included in the cost of other items.

Contractor shall obtain cut permits from Right of Way Department prior to construction. No work shall take place until permits have been issued.

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
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
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
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
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

The Fairfield Avenue Lighting Improvement project includes new historic "Acorn" style street lights between Rudisill Boulevard and Rose Lane (near former Duemling Clinic property) and will include the following:

- Removal of 17 existing high pressure sodium fixtures, 11 wood poles, 10 overhead span wires, and 8 existing fiberglass poles.
- Installation of 48 new ornamental fiberglass poles and "acorn" style LED fixtures. 40 of the new
  light assemblies will be placed on new concrete bases with new underground wire, and 8 new
  fixtures will utilize existing concrete bases and existing underground wire.
- Installation of 4 new "Cobra" LED fixtures placed on existing aluminum or wood poles at selected intersections.
- Installation of 5,000 lineal feet of new underground wire in protective bore tube.
- Installation of 4 new electrical service points.

### Funding:

Community Development Block Grant and CEDIT

### Implications of Not Being Approved:

This project is part of a long running Fairfield Corridor Improvement Initiative. Community Development has been working with the Fairfield Avenue Corridor Improvement Committee, which is a subgroup of the Packard Area Planning Alliance (PAPA, a collaborative neighborhood planning group, consisting of seven neighborhoods). This lighting will enhance the historic character of the neighborhood, and improve the aesthetics of this important corridor. Denial of this project will hamper the efforts of these groups to improve Fairfield Avenue and leave the corridor with inadequate and unattractive lighting.

In addition, this lighting project was critical in the project scoring, funding, and eventual approval of the **Specialized Alternatives for Families and Youth (SAFY)** project, now taking place (at the former Duemling Clinic property). This is an Indiana Housing & Community Development Authority project, involving the removal of the existing building and replacing it with a new independent living, residential facility for aged-out-foster-kids. Residents must be in school or employed. This lighting project will increase area security and allow residents to walk safely within the neighborhood. Denial of this Street Lighting project could hamper or impede the SAFY project.

## Other Info

This project was advertised to contractors on October 19, 2012 in the Ft. Wayne News Sentinel, October 26, 2012 in the Ft. Wayne Journal Gazette, and October 24, 2012 in Frost, Inc.

The contract for Resolution #51083 awarded to City Lights & Signals for \$223,285 was the lowest and most responsive bidder of four bidders and 3.6% below the Engineer's estimate of \$231,516. The second lowest bidder was \$51,735 above City Lights & Signal's bid.
