AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING VARIABLE
CONVEYANCE CHARGES FOR CONTRACT SEWER
CUSTOMERS, RATIFYING CONVEYANCE CHARGES FOR
CONTRACT SEWER CUSTOMERS AND AMENDING
CHAPTER 51 OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE CODE OF
ORDANCES

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code 36-9-23-26, the Common Council of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana has enacted a User Charge System and a Sewer Use Ordinance as contained in Chapter 51 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances calls for an annual review of the Water Pollution Control Utility's current service charges and surcharges by the Board of Public Works to determine whether said charges provide sufficient revenue to offset the cost of all treatment works operation and maintenance provided by the Utility, including the cost of management, system repair and replacement, debt retirement and the costs incidental to the Utility operation; and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 8-1.5-3-8 states that rates and charges of municipally owned utilities are unlawful if they are too low to produce income sufficient to maintain the utility property in a sound physical condition to render adequate and efficient services; and

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility has incorporated plans for the treatment plant, sewer capacity and water quality capital projects into the Sewer Capital Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the Water Pollution Control Utility's capital, operation and maintenance costs have been examined by a cost of service study

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completed in June 2009, which allocates the costs of the utility across customer classes; and

WHEREAS, upon review of the Sewer Capital Improvement Program, operation and maintenance costs and the cost of service study, the Board of Public Works of the City of Fort Wayne Indiana, in accordance with IC 36-9-23-25 recommends that existing rates and charges for the use of and services rendered by the Water Pollution Control Utility do not provide sufficient revenue to:

- (a) Pay all expenses incidental to the operation of the sewage works including legal **expenses**, maintenance costs, operating charges, repairs, lease rentals, and interest charges on bonds or other obligations; and
 - (b) Provide the sinking fund required by IC 36-9-23-21 for proposed debt; and
 - (c) Provide adequate money to be used as working capital; and
 - (c) Provide adequate money for improving and replacing the works; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Works recommends that an adjustment to the conveyance rates charged to contract customers of the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility as set forth in "Exhibit A" is necessary to meet the requirements of IC 36-9-23-25; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Works has approved sewer conveyance rates for contract customers since 1997.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of Fort Wayne finds it in the best interest of the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility to ratify and approve the sewer conveyance rates for contract customers set by the Board of Public Works from 1997-2012 and to approve new sewer conveyance rates for contract customers as shown in Exhibit A attached to this Ordinance.

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility has private water exemption meters for customers that use water which is not discharged to the sewer; and

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility staff reviewed the cost of reading private water exemption meters including but not limited to deduct, adduct and private well meters; and

WHEREAS, after said review the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility staff deemed private water exemption meter reading as inefficient and as a non-uniform cost to the Utility's customers; and

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility staff recommend an amendment to Chapter 51 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances the property owner or person in charge of the property responsible for private water exemption meters for reading said meters.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That in order to provide income sufficient to maintain the utility property in sound physical and financial condition to render adequate and efficient service to its users while implementing requirements of the EPA and the Utility's approved Capital Improvement Plan, to adjust the City of Fort Wayne Code Section 51.074 Wholesale Contract Customers – Unit and other Charges, (B) Variable Charge (per 100 cubic feet) as shown in "Exhibit A" attached hereto.

SECTION 2. That the Wholesale Contract Customer Variable
Charges adopted by Board of Works from 1997-2012 be ratified and
approved and that the adjustments to such charges as shown in "Exhibit A"

attached hereto be approved and become effective on the dates shown on "Exhibit A".

SECTION 3. That Section 51.067 be amended as follows:

- (A) Where a significant portion of the metered water does not and cannot enter the sewerage system, either directly or indirectly, the person having charge of the property may request permission from the city to install at the user's expense either an approved meter or meters to determine the quantity of water that cannot enter the sewerage system or an approved sewage measuring device or devices to determine the volume of sewage that actually enters the sewerage system. In any case the service charge shall be based on the quantity of water that can or actually does enter the public sewers but in no case shall it be less than the minimum charge for the class of user served. Plans and specifications for all such meters shall be submitted to the Superintendent of the Water Pollution Control Plan and approved prior to installation.
- (B) Unless otherwise provided in this section, the private water exemption meters including deduct, adduct and well meter(s) shall be read by the customer or the person having charge of the property. Exemption meter reads shall be reported to City Utilities by a date as required by City Utilities. Only exemption meter reads taken within a period of time set by City Utilities during the billing cycle will be deducted from the monthly city utility charge.

City Utilities staff shall audit the exemption meter reads annually. If there is a difference between the exemption meter read and the audit, a correction bill or credit will be issued to the customer's account.

Customers with private water exemption meters including deduct, adduct, and well meter(s) may request City Utilities staff to read the private water exemption meter(s) for a monthly fee of \$20.00 for each

private exemption account and \$8.00 for each private exemption meter associated with the private exemption account. In the event a customer with a private water exemption meter does not report their meter read to City Utilities, City Utilities may read the private water exemption meter for a fee of \$20.00 for each private exemption account and \$8.00 for each private exemption meter associated with the private exemption account

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and upon passage and approval by the Mayor.

RE:

Revisions to Chapter 51: Sewers

The City requests that this Council approve the following revisions to Chapter 51: Sewers, as follows:

- 1. In 2009, this Council approved a 5 year wastewater rate plan for all rates and for all customers, except the conveyance portion of contract customer rates. The intent was for those rates to be revisited annually. The attached Exhibit A sets new conveyance rates for contract customers in a manner that is consistent with all other customers as well as consistent with the guidance from the original 2009 Cost of Service Study. Effective date of the rates is as noted in Exhibit A.
- 2. As a cost reduction effort, the Utilities will discontinue the reading of meters that measure water used in a customer's product or used to cool their facilities. Instead City Utilities is developing a convenient internet solution to have customers read and post their own meter data. If customers do not want to read their own meters, this ordinance establishes a meter reading fee to reimburse the utility for the cost to provide the meter reading service. The meter reading fee will go into effect on January 1, 2014.
- 3. Ratification of the Wholesale Contract Customer Variable Charge set by the Board of Works from 1997- 2012 by this Common Council.
