## SPECIAL ORDINANCE NO. S-

AN ORDINANCE of the Common Council extending the Collective Bargaining Agreement for 2013 for one (1) year and fixing, establishing and ratifying compensation for certain City employees represented by The Fraternal Order of Police, Indiana Wayne Lodge #14, Inc.

WHEREAS, The City of Fort Wayne, Indiana (the "City"), and employees of the City represented by the Fraternal Order of Police, Wayne Lodge #14 (the 'F.O.P.") are parties to a collective bargaining agreement which by its term expires on December 31, 2013 (the "2013 Contract"); and

WHEREAS, the City and the F.O.P. have agreed to a one (1) year extension of the 2013 Contract with an increase to base wages of two percent (2%); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana law, the compensation provided for therein must be annually ratified; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is necessary to ratify, fix and establish such compensation increased by two percent (2%) for the year 2014 for said F.O.P. employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

**SECTION 1**. The one (1) year extension of the 2013 Contract by and between the Fraternal Order Police Wayne Lodge #14,. and the City of Fort Wayne, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the City Clerk and available for public inspection, is hereby approved and ratified in all respects.
