A CONFIRMING RESOLUTION designating an "Economic Revitalization Area" under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1 for property commonly known as 8415 North Clinton Park Drive, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46825 (AccuTemp Products, Inc.)

CONFIRMING RESOLUTION NO. R-

**WHEREAS,** Common Council has previously designated and declared by Declaratory Resolution the following described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" under Sections 153.13-153.24 of the Municipal Code of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, to wit:

## Attached hereto as "Exhibit A" as if a part herein; and

WHEREAS, said project will create 14 full-time, permanent jobs for a total new, annual payroll of \$561,455, with the average new annual job salary being \$40,104 and retain 53 full-time, permanent jobs for a total current annual payroll of \$2,450,085, with the average current, annual job salary being \$46,228; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$263,354; and

**WHEREAS,** a recommendation has been received from the Committee on Finance on said Resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, notice of the adoption and substance of said Resolution has been published in accordance with I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-2.5 and I.C. 5-3-1 and a public hearing has been conducted on said Resolution.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

**SECTION 1.** That, the Resolution previously designating the above described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" is confirmed in all respects.

**SECTION 2.** That, the hereinabove described property is hereby declared an "Economic Revitalization Area" pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, said designation to begin on the effective date of this Resolution and shall terminate on December 31, 2016, unless otherwise automatically extended in five year increments per I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-9.

**SECTION 3.** That, said designation of the hereinabove described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" shall apply to a deduction of the assessed value of personal property for new information technology equipment.

**SECTION 4.** That, the estimate of the number of individuals that will be employed or whose employment will be retained and the estimate of the annual salaries of those individuals and the estimate of the value of the new information technology equipment, all

contained in Petitioner's Statement of Benefits are reasonable and are benefits that can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed described installation of the new information technology equipment.

**SECTION 5.** The current year approximate tax rates for taxing units within the City would be:

- (a) If the proposed new information technology equipment is not installed, the approximate current year tax rates for this site would be \$3.1955/\$100.
- (b) If the proposed new information technology equipment is installed and no deduction is granted, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$3.1955/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- (c) If the proposed new information technology equipment is installed, and a deduction percentage of eighty percent (80%) is assumed, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$3.1955/\$100 (the change would be negligible).

**SECTION 6.** Pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, it is hereby determined that the deduction from the assessed value of the new information technology equipment shall be for a period of five years.

**SECTION 7.** The deduction schedule from the assessed value of new information technology equipment pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-17 shall look like this:

**SECTION 8.** The benefits described in the Petitioner's Statement of Benefits can be reasonably expected to result from the project and are sufficient to justify the applicable deductions.

**SECTION 9.** For new information technology equipment, a deduction application must contain a performance report showing the extent to which there has been compliance with the Statement of Benefits form approved by the Fort Wayne Common Council at the time of filing. This report must be submitted to the Allen County Auditor's Office, and the City of Fort Wayne's Community Development Division and must be included with the deduction application. For subsequent years, the performance report must be updated and submitted along with the deduction application at the time of filing.

	(b) The number of employees hired through the end of the preceding calendar year as a result of the deduction.	
4	(c) The total salaries of the employees hired through the end of the preceding	
5	calendar year as a result of the deduction.	
6	(d) The total number of employees employed at the facility receiving the deduction.	
7	(e) The total assessed value of the real and/or personal property deductions.	
8	(f) The tax savings resulting from the real and/or personal property being abated.	
	SECTION 11. That, the taxpayer is non-delinquent on any and all property tax due	
9	to jurisdictions within Allen County, Indiana.	
10	SECTION 12. That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-12 et al, any property owner that has received a deduction under section 3 or 4.5 of said chapter may be required to repay the	
11	deduction amount as determined by the county auditor in accordance with section 12 of said	
12	chapter if the property owner ceases operations at the facility for which the deduction was	
	granted and if the Common Council finds that the property owner obtained the deduction by	
13	intentionally providing false information concerning the property owner's plans to continue	
14	operation at the facility.	
15	SECTION 13. That, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its	
16	passage and any and all necessary approval by the Mayor.
