**SECTION 1.** That, subject to the requirements of Section 6, below, the property hereinabove described is hereby designated and declared an "Economic Revitalization Area" under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1. Said designation shall begin upon the effective date of the Confirming Resolution referred to in Section 6 of this Resolution and shall terminate on December 31, 2016, unless otherwise automatically extended in five year increments per I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-9.

#### **SECTION 2.** That, upon adoption of the Resolution:

- Said Resolution shall be filed with the Allen County Assessor:
- Said Resolution shall be referred to the Committee on Finance requesting a recommendation from said committee concerning the advisability of designating the above area an "Economic Revitalization Area";
- Common Council shall publish notice in accordance with I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-2.5 and I.C. 5-3-1 of the adoption and substance of this resolution and setting this designation as an "Economic Revitalization Area" for public hearing.

**SECTION 3.** That, said designation of the hereinabove described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" shall apply to both a deduction of the assessed value of real

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estate and personal property for new manufacturing, logistical distribution and information technology equipment.

SECTION 4. That, the estimate of the number of individuals that will be employed or whose employment will be retained and the estimate of the annual salaries of those individuals and the estimate of the value of redevelopment or rehabilitation and the estimate of the value of new manufacturing, logistical distribution and information technology equipment, all contained in Petitioner's Statement of Benefits, are reasonable and are benefits that can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed described redevelopment or rehabilitation and from the installation of new manufacturing, logistical distribution and information technology equipment.

**SECTION 5.** That, the current year approximate tax rates for taxing units within the City would be:

- If the proposed development does not occur, the approximate current year tax rates for this site would be \$2.9006/\$100.
- If the proposed development does occur and no deduction is granted, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.9006/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- If the proposed development occurs and a deduction percentage of fifty percent (50%) is assumed, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.9006/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- If the proposed new manufacturing, logistical distribution and information technology equipment is not installed, the approximate current year tax rates for this site would be \$2,9006/\$100.
- If the proposed new manufacturing, logistical distribution and information technology equipment is installed and no deduction is granted, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.9006/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- If the proposed new manufacturing, logistical distribution and information technology equipment is installed and a deduction percentage of eighty percent (80%) is assumed, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.9006/\$100 (the change would be negligible).

**SECTION 6.** That, this Resolution shall be subject to being confirmed, modified and confirmed, or rescinded after public hearing and receipt by Common Council of the above described recommendations and resolution, if applicable.

**SECTION 7.** That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, it is hereby determined that the deduction from the assessed value of the real property shall be for a period of ten years, and

the deduction from the assessed value of the new manufacturing, logistical distribution and information technology equipment shall be for a period of ten years.
