DECLARATORY RESOLUTION NO. R-____

A DECLARATORY RESOLUTION designating an "Economic Revitalization Area" under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1 for property commonly known as 5814 Reed Road, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46835 (The Medical Protective Company)

WHEREAS, Petitioner has duly filed its petition dated August 13, 2015 to have the following described property designated and declared an "Economic Revitalization Area" under Sections 153.13-153.24 of the Municipal Code of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, to wit:

Attached hereto as "Exhibit A" as if a part herein; and

WHEREAS, said project will create 70 full-time, permanent jobs for a total new, annual payroll of \$4,035,000, with the average new annual job salary being \$57,643 and retain 346 full-time, permanent jobs for a total current annual payroll of \$24,941,689, with the average current, annual job salary being \$72,086; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$4,180,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears the said petition should be processed to final determination in accordance with the provisions of said Division 6.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That, subject to the requirements of Section 6, below, the property hereinabove described is hereby designated and declared an "Economic Revitalization Area" under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1. Said designation shall begin upon the effective date of the Confirming Resolution referred to in Section 6 of this Resolution and shall terminate on December 31, 2016, unless otherwise automatically extended in five year increments per I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-9.

SECTION 2. That, upon adoption of the Resolution:

- (a) Said Resolution shall be filed with the Allen County Assessor;
- (b) Said Resolution shall be referred to the Committee on Finance requesting a recommendation from said committee concerning the advisability of designating the above area an "Economic Revitalization Area";
- (c) Common Council shall publish notice in accordance with I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-2.5 and I.C. 5-3-1 of the adoption and substance of this resolution and setting this designation as an "Economic Revitalization Area" for public hearing.

SECTION 3. That, said designation of the hereinabove described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" shall apply to both a deduction of the assessed value of real estate and personal property for new information technology equipment.

SECTION 4. That, the estimate of the number of individuals that will be employed or whose employment will be retained and the estimate of the annual salaries of those individuals and the estimate of the value of redevelopment or rehabilitation and the estimate of the value of new information technology equipment, all contained in Petitioner's Statement of Benefits, are reasonable and are benefits that can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed described redevelopment or rehabilitation and from the installation of new information technology equipment.

SECTION 5. That, the current year approximate tax rates for taxing units within the City would be:

- (a) If the proposed development does not occur, the approximate current year tax rates for this site would be \$3.4129/\$100.
- (b) If the proposed development does occur and no deduction is granted, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$3.4129/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- (c) If the proposed development occurs and a deduction percentage of fifty percent (50%) is assumed, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$3.4129/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- (d) If the proposed new information technology equipment is not installed, the approximate current year tax rates for this site would be \$3.4129/\$100.
- (e) If the proposed new information technology equipment is installed and no deduction is granted, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$3.4129/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- (f) If the proposed new information technology equipment is installed and a deduction percentage of eighty percent (80%) is assumed, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$3.4129/\$100 (the change would be negligible).

SECTION 6. That, this Resolution shall be subject to being confirmed, modified and confirmed, or rescinded after public hearing and receipt by Common Council of the above described recommendations and resolution, if applicable.

SECTION 7. That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, it is hereby determined that the deduction from the assessed value of the real property shall be for a period of ten years, and the deduction from the assessed value of the new information technology equipment shall be for a period of ten years.

SECTION 8. The deduction schedule from the assessed value of the real property pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-17 shall look like this:

SECTION 10. That, the benefits described in the Petitioner's Statement of Benefits can be reasonably expected to result from the project and are sufficient to justify the applicable deductions.

SECTION 11. That, the taxpayer is non-delinquent on any and all property tax due to jurisdictions within Allen County, Indiana.

SECTION 12. That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-12 et al, any property owner that has received a deduction under section 3 or 4.5 of this chapter may be required to repay the

deduction amount as determined by the county auditor in accordance with section 12 of said chapter if the property owner ceases operations at the facility for which the deduction was granted and if the Common Council finds that the property owner obtained the deduction by intentionally providing false information concerning the property owner's plans to continue operation at the facility. SECTION 13. That, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and any and all necessary approval by the Mayor. In order to be considered an Economic Revitalization Area (ERA), the area must be within the corporate limits of the City of Fort Wayne and must have become undesirable for, or impossible of, normal development and occupancy because of a lack of development, cessation of growth, deterioration of improvements or character of occupancy, age, obsolescence, substandard buildings, or other factors which have impaired values or prevent a normal development of property or use of property. It also includes any area where a facility or group of facilities that are technologically, economically, or energy obsolete is located and where the obsolescence may lead to a decline in employment and tax revenues.

How does the property for which you are requesting designation meet the above definition of an ERA?

MedPro is planning to expand operations to meet the needs of its growing insurance business. Over the next four years, MedPro anticipates the addition of ~70 full-time positions with an average annual salary of \$58,000. Expansion options are being considered in Fort Wayne as well as outside Indiana. In Fort Wayne, there is an immediate need to accommodate ~50 employees that could be accomplished through reconfiguration and remodeling of existing workspace. However, a longer-term solution is necessary to accommodate projected employment growth. The Company is planning an 11,000 sq. ft. addition to the existing facility (~\$5.5M). Though MedPro has enjoyed its Fort Wayne home office location for nearly a century, the company's other office locations sometimes make it easier to attract talent. Nonetheless, MedPro hopes to remain in Fort Wayne for another century attracting as much talent as possible to the area, and deepening our partnership with local and state governmental entities.
