

AN ORDINANCE approving the payment of Yearly Maintenance for Asset and Work Management software at a total cost of \$117,259 from and through Infor Public Sector, Inc. by the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana,

Whereas, said software is used for the maintenance and repair of Fort Wayne's public infrastructure, such as water mains, water valves, fire hydrants, sewer mains, street lights, and streets of Fort Wayne;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the purchase of Yearly Maintenance for Asset and Work Management software from Infor Public Sector, Inc. for a total of cost to the City of \$117,259 is hereby approved in all respects. That said Yearly Maintenance will be used to ensure the proper maintenance of the City's public infrastructure.

SECTION 2. That the City is authorized and directed to take all action necessary for the payment of software maintenance of this system by and through Infor Public Sector, Inc.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and any and all necessary approval by the Mayor.

Subject: Yearly Maintenance for Infor Asset Management software

Members of City Council:

This ordinance is to authorize the purchase of yearly maintenance for asset management software from Infor Public Sector, Inc. for the maintenance and repair of the City's infrastructure. This year's cost of maintenance for this software is \$117,259.

The software is used to track assets for:

- Water Maintenance and Service (Mains, Hydrants, Valves)
- Water Pollution Control Maintenance (Mains, Manholes, Inlets),
- Street Department (Streets, Intersections),
- Street Light Operations (Poles, Lights).

The software also manages Inventory Tracking, Preventative Maintenance Scheduling, and Requests for Repairs for the above departments and Sewer Engineering.

This cost for this software is divided between Fort Wayne Civil City (25%) and Fort Wayne City Utilities (75%). The share was determined by the approximate ratio of infrastructure assets under control of the system.

Our decision to pay maintenance rests on four tests:

- Do we have a continuing internal commitment to use this software?
- Is the software vendor continuing to improve the product?
- Is the vendor useful in solving problems with the software?
- If the software fails, what's the worst case scenario?

The Civil City and City Utilities both have substantial investments in the use of Infor Asset Management software. Infor provides regular updates to the software and supports our day to day operation of the software.
