The City will be constructing the Pufferbelly Trail from Wallen Road to Ludwig Road in 2017 along the former New York Central Railroad corridor. This will be a 1.5 mile extension of the Pufferbelly Trail that already exists from Life Bridge Church to Wallen Road (2.65 miles). Connections include numerous neighborhoods, Northrop High School, Shawnee Middle School, Lincoln Elementary, numerous businesses and Smith Field Airport.
