## CSO OUTFALL IMPROVEMENT AGREEMENT

This CSO Outfall Improvement Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of the \_\_ day of August \_\_, 2018, by and between the Northern Indiana Public Service Company, LLC, ("NIPSCO") and the City of Fort Wayne, by its Board of Public Works (the "City").

## RECITALS

- A. The City owns and operates the combined sewer outfall identified in the NPDES permit issued by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management ("IDEM") as CSO outfall #29 (the "Outfall"). The Outfall discharges to the St. Mary's River and is located within an easement through property owned by Hall's Gas House, LLC.
- B. NIPSCO intends to complete certain remedial work within the St. Mary's River proximate to the Outfall beginning in September 2018. That remedial work will also include activities to stabilize areas of the bank of the St. Mary's River proximate to the Outfall.
- C. NIPSCO believes that the Outfall and its associated river bank are in need of repair, and that, if not repaired, discharges from the Outfall will impair NIPSCO's intended remedial work in the St. Mary's River. The City agrees that improvements to the Outfall and its associated bank are warranted.
- D. NIPSCO and the City have agreed that construction plans attached as <u>Exhibit A</u> (the "<u>Plans</u>") reflect the scope of appropriate improvements for the Outfall and its associated riverbank (the "<u>Improvements</u>").
- E. Under certain terms and conditions, NIPSCO and the City wish to work cooperatively to cause the Improvements to be implemented between October 2018 and May 2019.

## **AGREEMENT**

In consideration of the covenants, representations and agreements reflected below, the parties agree as follows.

1. Improvement Construction & Dedication. NIPSCO agrees to cause the Improvements to be constructed beginning in October 2018 in accordance with the Plans. Except as noted below, NIPSCO shall be solely responsible for the costs to construct the Improvements. The City agrees to cause City staff (at the City's sole cost) to (a) provide appropriate oversight to the construction work, (b) provide two of the three 12" pumps reflected on the Plans to redirect CSO flows on or before October 1, 2018 through December 1, 2018, (c) provide all hosing associated with the 12" pumps provided by the City necessary to redirect CSO flows as directed on the Plans, and, (d) following completion of the construction work, to (i) inspect and accept (dedicate) the constructed combined sewer improvements as part of the City's public sewer

system and (ii) thereafter maintain and repair the improved Outfall as the City deems appropriate. NIPSCO shall not be liable to the City for the Improvements thereafter.

- 2. City Payment. The City agrees to pay NIPSCO the sum of \$270,000.00 (the "Total Payment") in consideration for NIPSCO's work to complete the Improvements. An initial payment of \$120,000.00 from the Total Payment will be made by the City to NIPSCO in 2018 if Improvement construction work of at least \$120,000.00 is completed in 2018 and NIPSCO timely invoices the City in 2018 for that sum. The Total Payment shall be paid to NIPSCO in full in 2019 following completion of all Improvement construction and acceptance of the improved Outfall by the City.
- 3. Outfall Activations During Construction. The parties acknowledge that flows from the City's combined sewer system will be prevented from discharging through the Outfall while NIPSCO is completing the Improvements. As reflected on the Plans, NIPSCO will cause flows which would have otherwise been directed to the Outfall to instead be directed (using pumps and hosing reflected on the Plans and, in part, provided by the City pursuant to Section 1(b) and (c)) to a nearby stormwater sewer which also discharges to the St. Mary's River (the "Stormwater Outfall"). The City represents that it has obtained all necessary approvals from IDEM for the use of the Stormwater Outfall to receive and discharge such combined sewer flows. The parties also acknowledge that conditions may occur beyond the capacity of the aforementioned pumps or Stormwater Outfall which would require the use of high-capacity additional pumps or other means to address extreme combined sewer system discharges and that they will work cooperatively at their own costs to address extreme conditions if such arise.
- 4. Approvals. Except as noted above, NIPSCO shall be solely responsible to obtain all governmental and property owner approvals necessary to complete the Improvements. The parties acknowledge that modifications to the Plans may be proposed by NIPSCO following its selection of a contractor to implement the Improvements in August 2018 and agree to work expeditiously in good faith to propose and consider any such modification requests. Once approved by the City, any modified plans shall replace and supersede those attached as Exhibit A.
- 5. **Notices.** Any notice, designation, consent, approval, offer, acceptance, statement, request, or other communication (a "<u>Notice</u>") required or allowed under this Agreement shall be in writing. Notice to a party shall be given at the party's address stated below, or at such other address as a party may designate in a Notice to the other party: Any party may change the names of those to receive Notices by providing a Notice to the other parties clearly providing the modified contact information.

Notice shall be deemed given when: (i) personal service of the Notice is made on the party to be notified; (ii) the Notice is mailed to the party to be notified by means of certified or registered U.S. mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid; or (iii) the Notice is sent to the party to be notified by express courier such as "Federal Express", or such other similar carrier guaranteeing next day delivery, fees prepaid. Refusal by a party to accept a Notice shall not affect the giving of the Notice. If agreed by the parties in a later writing, the parties may also accept email communications as a Notice under this Agreement.

# 6. Indemnification.

- 6.1 *Indemnification by NIPSCO*. NIPSCO shall indemnify, defend, and hold the City harmless from and against any and all claims, liabilities, actions, demands, and causes of action asserted by any third party which arise as a result of the following:
  - (a) NIPSCO's performance or failure to perform any of the obligations required of it under the terms of this Agreement, including a failure to construct the Improvements in accordance with the Plans; or
  - (b) The condition or function of the Improvements prior to the City's acceptance of the Improvements as part of the public sewer system.
- 6.2 *Indemnification by the City*. The City shall indemnify, defend, and hold NIPSCO harmless from and against any and all claims, liabilities, actions, demands, and causes of action asserted by any third party which arise out of the following:
  - (a) The City's performance or failure to perform any of the obligations required of it under the terms of this Agreement; or
  - (b) The condition or function of the Improvements following the City's acceptance of the Improvements as part of the public sewer system.

## 7. Miscellaneous.


- 7.1 *Binding Agreement*. This Agreement shall bind and apply to the City and NIPSCO and their respective successors and assigns.
- 7.2 Invalid Provision/Severability. The invalidity or unenforceability of any particular portion of this Agreement shall not affect the other provisions of it, and this Agreement shall be construed in all respects as if such invalid or unenforceable provision was omitted.
- 7.3 Amendments. No amendments, modifications, alterations, or additions to this Agreement shall be binding unless made in writing and signed by the City and NIPSCO or their respective legal representatives.
- 7.4 Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Indiana.
- 7.5 Rule of Construction. The judicial rule of construction requiring or allowing a document to be construed to the detriment or against the interests of the document's maker or drafter shall not apply to this Agreement.
- 7.6 *Headings*. The section headings in this Agreement are included solely for convenience, and shall not affect or be used in connection with the interpretation of this Agreement

- 7.7 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but together the counterparts shall constitute one and the same document.
- 7.8 *Recitals*. All recitals set forth in this Agreement are incorporated by reference and are true.
- 7.9 Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement among the parties concerning Materials and supersedes any prior agreements and understandings, both written and oral, between the City and NIPSCO with respect to the subject matter contained herein.
- 7.10 Agreement Subject to Approval by the Fort Wayne Board of Public Works and the Common Council of the City of Fort Wayne. This Agreement is subject to approval by the City's Board of Public Works and the Common Council for the City. Should any required approval not be obtained, this Agreement shall be void, and the parties' respective obligations hereunder shall terminate. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing in this Section shall relieve either party of any obligation required of such party under local, state, or federal law.
- 7.11 Review by Counsel and Authority to Sign. The City and NIPSCO acknowledge that they have each had the opportunity to have this Agreement reviewed by their respective attorneys prior to its execution and that they each have the authority to execute this Agreement binding their respective entities.

Agreement between the NIPSCO and the City of Fort Wayne for CSO Outfall Improvements. As part of a larger project on the St. Mary's River, NIPSCO agrees to improve CSO Outfall 029 by stabilizing and armoring the existing CSO 029 Outfall through the use of sheet piling and riprap. NIPSCO is the lead entity for this project and is responsible for bidding the project, procuring permits, etc. The City of Fort Wayne agrees to reimburse NIPSCO a not-to-exceed fee of \$270,000 for this improvement, which is a substantially lower cost than if the City were to undertake this project on its own.

Implications of not being approved: CSO 029 is located on the St. Mary's River adjacent to Hall's Gashouse Restaurant parking lot and near Headwaters Park. The outfall structure for CSO 029 is in need of repair for continued long-term use. If the agreement with NIPSCO is not approved, CSO 029 will continue to deteriorate and increase the potential for failure. A future repair to the outfall would impact parking for Hall's Gashouse Restaurant and Headwaters Park. Additionally, City Utilities would incur full project costs of the project rather than cost sharing with another agency. The City considered doing this project alone in 2011. At that time, the engineer's estimate was \$470,000 and the bids came in substantially higher than the estimate. Accordingly, the City rejected all bids.
