AMEND SECTION 74.40 (1), (3)

- (1) Any multi-wheeled transportation device operated by a rider, other than an automobile or motorcycle;
- (3) Owned by a p\Person that owns, manages, and maintains devices for shared use by members of the public without a physical dispatching location within the city; and

AMEND SECTION 74.40 – OPERATOR

OPERATOR. Any Person who owns, operates, leases, offers to rent, collects, distributes, repairs, services, charges or otherwise asserts control of a dockless vehicle share system.

AMEND SECTION 74.41 PROHIBITED

No Person may operate a Dockless Mobility System in the city, including the right-ofway, such as a sidewalk, alley, street, highway or any other public place within the City.

AMEND SECTION 74.42 EXCEPTION

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the operation of a Dockless Mobility System shall be permitted if the Operator is selected to participate in a dockless vehicle share pilot study administered by the Department of Community Development and City Council. Participation in the pilot study may only occur upon application and approval of the Department of Right-of-Way and City Council.

AMEND SECTION 74.43 REMOVAL OF DOCKLESS VEHICLES

If the city finds on any right-of-way, such as a sidewalk, alley, street, highway or other public place within the city, any dockless vehicle belonging to an Operator who is in violation of this section, the City may have the Dockless Vehicle immediately removed to a suitable place of impoundment. A notice informing the Operator of the location of the Dockless Vehicle and the procedure for reclaiming the Dockless Vehicle shall be sent to the Operator's corporate headquarters within 24 hours after removal.

AMEND SECTION 74.44 PERIOD OF IMPOUNDMENT

Upon impoundment, a Dockless Vehicle shall be held a minimum of thirty (30) days unless earlier redeemed by the Operator or Operator's representative upon payment of the redemption fee provided in § 74.99.

AMEND SECTION 74.45 DISPOSITION OF UNREDEEMED DOCKLESS VEHICLES

The City may dispose of impounded Dockless Vehicles that are not redeemed within thirty (30) days in any of the following ways:

- (A) Public auction or sale.
- (B) Donation to a suitable nonprofit organization for charitable, educational or other charitable purposes.
- (C) Scrapping a Dockless Vehicle that cannot be disposed of through any other reasonable means.

AMEND SECTION 74.46 OPERATOR RESPONSIBLE FOR COSTS

The Operator of any Dockless Vehicle removed under this provision shall be responsible for all costs of impounding and disposing of the Dockless Vehicle. Costs not recovered from the sale of the Dockless Vehicle may be recovered in a civil action by the City against the operator. The City assumes no responsibility for damage to Dockless Vehicle(s) impounded under this Chapter.

ADD SECTION 74.47 AGE REQUIREMENT

No Person under the age of eighteen shall be permitted to rent or operate a Dockless Vehicle. A violation of this section shall subject the individual, Operator or guardian of the individual a citation.

ADD SECTION 74.48 SPECIAL EVENTS

No person shall operate a Dockless Vehicle within the designated boundaries of a special event for which a special event permit has been obtained.

ADD NEW SECTION

MOTORIZED SCOOTERS

§ 74.60 DEFINITION.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definition shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

MOTORIZED SCOOTER

Any conveyance or device propelled by a motor, not having a seat or a saddle for the use of the rider, with one or more wheels in contact with the ground, and with a floorboard for the user to stand upon.

§ 74.61 OPERATION OF MOTORIZED SCOOTERS.

- (A) Every person riding a Motorized Scooter upon a street shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle. Every person riding a motorized scooter upon a sidewalk shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to a pedestrian.
- (B) The regulations in the traffic code applicable to Motorized Scooters shall apply whenever a Motorized Scooter is operated upon any roadway or public sidewalk or upon any shared-use path, subject to those exceptions stated herein.
- (C) The operator of a Motorized Scooter shall not overtake standing vehicles in a travel lane.

- (A) A person operating a Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk, multiuse path, multiuse trail, or within a crosswalk shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian.
- (B) A person who is operating a Motorized Scooter and who is passing a pedestrian traveling on the same facility shall pass the pedestrian at a distance of at least three feet. If the person is operating the Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk or is unable to pass the pedestrian at a distance of at least three feet on any other facility, then the person operating the Motorized Scooter shall stop, dismount, or exit the facility.
- (C) A person operating a Motorized Scooter upon a multiuse path, multiuse trail, or within a crosswalk, before overtaking a person with a visual impairment who is carrying a white cane or who is guided by a service animal, shall dismount and pass on foot, if necessary, to avoid startling, inconveniencing or colliding with the person.
- (D) A person operating a Motorized Scooter shall give an audible signal before overtaking and passing any pedestrian while traveling in the same direction and on the same facility as the pedestrian. The audible signal may be given by voice or by bell or other warning device capable of giving an audible signal and shall be given at such a distance and in such a manner as to not startle the person or persons being passed.
- (E) A person operating a Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk, multiuse path, multiuse trail, or within a crosswalk shall not suddenly move into the path of a pedestrian, vehicle, or similar device so as to constitute an immediate hazard.
- (F) No person shall operate a Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk, multiuse path, or multiuse trail at a speed greater than ordinary pedestrian activity when approaching or entering a crosswalk or approaching or crossing a driveway or alley if a vehicle is approaching the crosswalk or driveway close enough to constitute a potential hazard.

■§ 74.63 NO ANIMALS PERMITTED.

No person shall operate a Motorized Scooter while controlling an animal, whether such control is by hand, by leash, or by any alternative medium.

It is a violation of this section for more than one person to be upon a motorized scooter at any time.

AMEND SECTION 74.99 PENALTY (A), (C), ADD NEW SECTIONS (D) AND (E)

№ 74.99 PENALTY.

- (A) Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this chapter, where another penalty is not expressly provided, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$2,500.
- (B) Every person convicted of a violation of § <u>74.50</u> shall be guilty of a class C infraction.
- (C) Any person violating the provisions of Chapter § 74.43 shall be subject to a fine of \$100 per day for each Dockless Vehicle operated or parked upon the right-of-way or any public place. For each subsequent violation, the fine shall be not less than \$200.
- (D) Any person violating the provisions of Sections § 74.47, §74.48, §74.61, §74.62, §74.63 or §74.64 shall be fined \$50. If the violator fails to pay the citation within a period of thirty (30) calendar days from the date shown on the notice, the penalty shall be \$100.
- (E) Fines for violations under this section shall be paid to the City of Fort Wayne Ordinance Violations Bureau who shall deposit the funds in the General Fund.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 74.01 (RESERVED).

S 74.02 ALTERATION OF MANUFACTURER'S SERIAL NUMBERS.

It shall be unlawful to destroy, remove, alter, cover or deface the manufacturer's serial number of any bicycle. It shall be unlawful for any person to own or have custody of a bicycle, the original manufacturer's serial number of which has been destroyed, removed, altered, covered or defaced.

BICYCLES

§ 74.34 OPERATION OF BICYCLES.

- (A) Every person riding a bicycle upon a street shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle. Every person riding a bicycle upon a sidewalk shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to a pedestrian.
- (B) The regulations in the traffic code applicable to bicycles shall apply whenever a bicycle is operated upon any roadway or public sidewalk or upon any shared-use path, subject to those exceptions stated herein.
 - (C) The operator of a bicycle shall not overtake standing vehicles in a travel lane.

§ 74.35 SPEED TO BE REASONABLE AND PRUDENT TO SURROUNDING CONDITIONS.

No person shall operate a bicycle at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then existing.

§ 74.36 EMERGING FROM ALLEYS OR DRIVEWAYS.

The operator of a bicycle emerging from an alley, driveway or building shall, upon approaching a sidewalk or the sidewalk area extending across any alleyway, yield the right-of-way to all pedestrians approaching on such sidewalk or sidewalk area, and upon entering the roadway shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on such roadway.

№ 74.37 PARKING OF BICYCLES.

No person shall park a bicycle upon the traveled portion of the street. Bicycles may be parked only upon the sidewalk area in a rack provided to support the bicycle, against a building or in such manner as to afford the least obstruction to pedestrian traffic.

§ 74.38 RIDING ON SIDEWALK AREA.

- (A) Whenever any person is riding a bicycle upon a sidewalk, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall give an audible signal before overtaking and passing such pedestrian.
 - (B) No person shall operate a moped or motorized bicycle on any sidewalk.

DOCKLESS VEHICLES

§ 74.40 DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

<u>DOCKLESS MOBILITY SYSTEM.</u> A shared mobility system or service that provides dockless vehicles for short-term rentals for point-to-point trips that is permitted to operate in the City, comprised of devices for the purpose of transportation or conveyance.

DOCKLESS VEHICLE.

- (1) Any <u>multi</u>—wheeled <u>transportation</u> device <u>operated by a rider</u>, other than an automobile or motorcycle that is powered by a motor;
- (2) Accessed via an on-demand portal, whether a smartphone application, membership card, or similar method;

- (3) Owned by a p\Person that owns, manages, and maintains devices for shared use by members of the public without a physical dispatching location within the city; and
- (4) Available at unstaffed, self-service locations, to members of the public for their personal operation.

OPERATOR. Any Person who owns, operates, leases, offers to rent, collects, distributes, repairs, services, charges or otherwise asserts control of a dockless vehicle share system.

PERSON. Any individual, firm, corporation, limited liability company, partnership or association acting in a fiduciary capacity.

№ 74.41 PROHIBITED.

No <u>P</u>person may operate a <u>dockless vehicle share <u>Dockless Mobility System</u> system in the city, including the right-of-way, such as a sidewalk, alley, street, highway or any other public place within the Ceity.</u>

₽§ 74.42 EXCEPTION.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the operation of a <u>D</u>eockless <u>Mobility System vehicle</u> share system shall be permitted if the <u>O</u>eperator <u>is selected to participate participates</u> in a dockless vehicle share pilot study administered by the Department of Community Development and City Council. Participation in the pilot study may only occur upon application and approval of the Department of Right-of-Way and City Council.

§ 74.43 REMOVAL OF DOCKLESS VEHICLES.

If the operator can be identified, Aa notice informing the Oeperator of the location of the Oelockless Vehicle and the procedure for reclaiming the Oelockless Vehicle shall be sent to the Oeperator's corporate headquarters within 24 hours after removal.

TOY VEHICLES

§ 74.50 USE OF COASTERS, ROLLER SKATES AND SIMILAR DEVICES RESTRICTED.

No person upon roller skates or other footwear with wheels, riding in or by means of any coaster, skateboard or toy vehicle or similar devices, shall go upon any roadway or designated on-street bicycle facility except while crossing a street or a crosswalk, and when so crossing, such person shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all the duties applicable to pedestrians. This section shall not apply upon any street while set aside as a play street as authorized by this chapter.

MOTORIZED SCOOTERS

№ 74.60 DEFINITION.

For the purpose of this chapter, the following definition shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

MOTORIZED SCOOTER

Any conveyance or device propelled by a motor, not having a seat or a saddle for the use of the rider, with one or more wheels in contact with the ground, and with a floorboard for the user to stand upon.

№ 74.61 OPERATION OF MOTORIZED SCOOTERS.

- (A) Every person riding a Mmotorized Sscooter upon a street shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle. Every person riding a motorized scooter upon a sidewalk shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to a pedestrian.
- (B) The regulations in the traffic code applicable to Motorized Scooters shall apply whenever a Motorized Scooter is operated upon any roadway or public sidewalk or upon any shared-use path, subject to those exceptions stated herein.
- (C) The operator of a Motorized Scooter shall not overtake standing vehicles in a travel lane.

S 74.62 RIDING NEAR PEDISTRIANS.

- (A) A person operating a Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk, multiuse path, multiuse trail, or within a crosswalk shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian.
- (B) A person who is operating a Motorized Scooter and who is passing a pedestrian traveling on the same facility shall pass the pedestrian at a distance of at least three feet. If the person is operating the Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk or is unable to pass the pedestrian at a distance of at least three feet on any other facility, then the person operating the Motorized Scooter shall stop, dismount, or exit the facility.
- (C) A person operating a Motorized Scooter upon a multiuse path, multiuse trail, or within a crosswalk, before overtaking a person with a visual impairment who is carrying a white cane or who is guided by a service animal, shall dismount and pass on foot, if necessary, to avoid startling, inconveniencing or colliding with the person.
- (D) A person operating a Motorized Scooter shall give an audible signal before overtaking and passing any pedestrian while traveling in the same direction and on the same facility as the pedestrian. The audible signal may be given by voice or by bell or other warning device capable of giving an audible signal and shall be given at such a distance and in such a manner as to not startle the person or persons being passed.
- (E) A person operating a Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk, multiuse path, multiuse trail, or within a crosswalk shall not suddenly move into the path of a pedestrian, vehicle, or similar device so as to constitute an immediate hazard.
- (F) No person shall operate a Motorized Scooter on a sidewalk, multiuse path, or multiuse trail at a speed greater than ordinary pedestrian activity when approaching or entering a crosswalk or approaching or crossing a driveway or alley if a vehicle is approaching the crosswalk or driveway close enough to constitute a potential hazard.

№ 74.63 NO ANIMALS PERMITTED.

No person shall operate a Motorized Scooter while controlling an animal, whether such control is by hand, by leash, or by any alternative medium.

§ 74.64 SINGLE RIDER.

It is a violation of this section for more than one person to be upon a motorized scooter at any time.

(A) Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this chapter, where another penalty is not expressly provided, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$100.than \$2,500.

- (B) Every person convicted of a violation of \S 74.50 shall be guilty of a class C infraction.
- (C) Any person violating the provisions of this-Chapter § 74.43 chapter shall be subject to a fine of \$100 per day for each Ddockless Vvehicle operated or parked upon the right-of-way or any public place. For each subsequent violation, the fine shall be not less than \$200.

(D) Any person violating the provisions of Sections § 74.47, §74.48, §74.61, §74.62, §74.63 or §74.64 shall be fined \$50. If the violator fails to pay the citation within a period of thirty (30) calendar days from the date shown on the notice, the penalty shall be \$100.

(E) Fines for violations under this section shall be paid to the City of Fort Wayne Ordinance Violations Bureau who shall deposit the funds in the General Fund.
