A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, STATING THE INTENTION TO UTILIZE THE INVESTIGATORY POWERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE

WHEREAS, the Fort Wayne Common Council of the serves as the legislative body of the City of Fort Wayne as codified in IC 36-4-4-4 (a); and

WHEREAS, as the legislative body, the Fort Wayne Common Council has all powers and responsibilities granted the legislative body by Indiana Code and the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, in IC 36-4-6-21 it is stated that the legislative body may investigate departments, officers, and employees of the city and the affairs of a person with whom the city has entered or is about to enter into a contract, and in conducting such an investigation the legislative body is entitled to access to all records pertaining to the investigation and may compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of evidence by subpoena and attachment served and executed in Allen County; and

WHEREAS, as stated in IC 36-4-6-21 if a person refuses to testify or produce evidence during this investigation, the matter may be referred to the court system for proper judgment; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Wayne is currently engaged in a contractual relationship with Red River Waste Solutions LP (Red River), which contract was approved and effective beginning in 2017 and pertains to garbage collection for all of the residents of the City of Fort Wayne (hereinafter referred to as "Red River Garbage Contract");

WHEREAS, City Council invited James Smith, CEO of Red River and signatory on behalf of Red River, to the Red River Garbage Contract between Red River and the City of Fort Wayne, to appear before and address Council at the Council meeting on November 16, 2021; and

WHEREAS, no response has been provided by Red River leadership to Council's request to appear and speak at the November 16, 2021 Council meeting, nor has there been any significant communication from Red River leadership to Council in the last two years; and

WHEREAS, Red River has now declared bankruptcy and has continued their limited communication with Council; and

WHEREAS, Common Council has an obligation to protect the interests of its citizens, including investigating matters that may have legal ramifications and result in costs funded by ratepayer dollars; and

WHEREAS, the investigatory ability of Common Council facilitates transparency and limits exposure of the City and its citizens by identifying facts pertinent to the matter at hand.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE FORT WAYNE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE INDIANA:

SECTION 1. The members of Common Council voting in the affirmative to this resolution wish to pursue an investigation into Red River Garbage Contract and the departments, officers, employees of Red River and the City, and all persons, agent and employees of any nature involved with the Red River Garbage Contract, and otherwise related to or regarding the handling of and involvement related to all aspects of the City of Fort Wayne's trash and recycling contracts. By this resolution, Council desires to invoke authority granted to it under IC 36-4-6-21 to subpoena, if necessary, any persons or parties involved or invested in this contract who may be subpoenaed under IC 36-4-6-21. Council asserts its entitlement to all records pertaining to Red River all contracts between the City of Fort Wayne and Red River and this investigation provided under IC 36-4-6-21.

SECTION 2. Council will create a three-member sub-committee to direct any investigation started under authority of this Resolution and IC 36-4-6-21 ("Investigation Committee"). The Investigation Committee will be tasked with reviewing the information requested and must report its findings to all Members of Council no later than 60 days after the passage of this resolution. There is an expectation that testimony will be given publicly at a regular Common Council meeting or an appropriately noticed special meeting of Council. The members of this sub-committee will be the President of Council and the Council-appointed members of the Solid Waste Advisory Board.

SECTION 3. Council fully intends to exercise all authority granted under IC 36-4-6-21. If a person refuses to testify or produce evidence during the investigation conducted under this section, the legislative body may order its clerk to immediately present to the circuit court, superior court, or probate court of the county a written report of the facts relating to the refusal. The court shall hear all questions relating to the refusal to testify or produce evidence, and shall also hear any new evidence not included in the clerk's report. If the court finds that the testimony or evidence sought should be given or produced, it shall order the person to testify or produce the evidence, or both.
