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7	A RESOLUTION IMPLEMENTING
8	RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE 2019 COUNCIL STUDY
9 10	COMMITTEE OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE LEGACY FUND
11 12	WHEREAS, on June 11, 2019 Fort Wayne Common Council passed Resolution R-22-19 requesting a comprehensive review by Council of policies and procedures related to the Legacy
13	Fund process; and
14	WHEREAS, a Council study committee, convened, discussed, and researched
15	community outlooks on the Legacy Fund (Fund) and the Joint Legacy Funding Committee
16	(LJFC); and
17	WHEREAS, questions that were addressed included, but were not limited to the role of
18	the status of the minimum balance in determining loans or grants, the role of the LJFC, the
19 20	structure of the committee, the role of staff in the process, and the relevance of the guidelines as previously determined; and
21 22	WHEREAS, it is generally agreed that the LJFC process works well and vets funding requests while providing an additional level of engagement and transparency, and should
23	continue to be the first point of contact for all projects with the exception of publically funded
24	projects and multi-sourced public-private development projects seeking funding; and
25	WHEREAS, after research and discussion four areas of concern and potential
26	improvement were identified; and
27	WHEREAS, the four (4) areas are Community Engagement, Committee Makeup,
28	Minimum Fund Balance, and Determination on Funding; and
29	WHEREAS, these recommendations were presented to Council on December 17, 2019
30	and was noted in the original resolution and at the meeting that recommendations would be
31	discussed and potentially adopted in 2020; and
32	WHEREAS, it is in the purview of Council to modify the policies and procedures of the
33	Legacy Joint Funding Committee with concurrence from the Mayor.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE INDIANA:

SECTION 1. To ensure greater Community Engagement, all proposals for Legacy funding shall be placed on the webpage dedicated to Legacy information by Community Development staff at least four (4) weeks before any formal meeting of the initiating body where the project may be discussed. The website on which the proposals are posted shall also have a comments section, to ensure that community comments are collected. Community Development shall also accept and distribute correspondence submitted through postal mail.

SECTION 2. To ensure more diverse LJFC membership, Common Council shall appoint four (4) representatives, to serve on the committee as follows: at least two (2) of the representatives shall be members of Common Council and of different political parties, and at least two (2) shall be citizen representatives. As the other appointing body, the office of the Mayor shall appoint four (4) representatives to serve on the committee as follows: at least two (2) of the representatives shall be administration officials and of different political parties and at least two (2) shall be citizen representatives. The ninth member of the committee shall be selected by the Council and Mayoral designees.

SECTION 3. To promote the longevity of the Fund, organizations requesting loans from the Fund will be viewed more favorably than those requesting grants.

SECTION 4. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and any and all necessary approval by the Mayor.
