

A CONFIRMING RESOLUTION designating an “Economic Revitalization Area” under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1 for property commonly known as 2314 Dunkleberg Road, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46819 (Brightpoint)

WHEREAS, Common Council has previously designated and declared by Declaratory Resolution the following described property as an “Economic Revitalization Area” under Sections 153.13-153.24 of the Municipal Code of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, to wit:

Attached hereto as “Exhibit A” as if a part herein; and

WHEREAS, said project will create two full-time jobs with a total annual payroll of \$83,200 and an average annual salary of \$41,600; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$9,100,000; and

WHEREAS, a recommendation has been received from the Committee on Finance; and

WHEREAS, notice of the adoption and substance of said Resolution has been published in accordance with I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-2.5 and I.C. 5-3-1 and a public hearing has been conducted on said Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That, the Resolution previously designating the above described property as an “Economic Revitalization Area” is confirmed in all respects.

SECTION 2. That, the hereinabove described property is hereby declared an “Economic Revitalization Area” pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, said designation to begin on the effective date of this Resolution and shall terminate on December 31, 2026, unless otherwise automatically extended in five year increments per I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-9.

SECTION 3. That, said designation of the hereinabove described property as an “Economic Revitalization Area” shall apply to a deduction of the assessed value of real property improvements to be made between April 1, 2023 and December 1, 2024. Should any delays occur, an updated timeframe will be communicated to the Allen County Assessor and Allen County Auditor by Community Development staff in writing.

SECTION 4. That, the estimate of the number of individuals that will be employed or whose employment will be retained and the estimate of the annual salaries of those individuals and the estimate of the value of redevelopment or rehabilitation, all contained in Petitioner ET Fort Wayne IV, LLC’s (“Petitioner”) Statement of Benefits submitted to the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana (“City”) are reasonable and are benefits that can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed described redevelopment or rehabilitation.

SECTION 5. The current year approximate tax rates for taxing units within the City would be:

- 1 (a) If the proposed development does not occur, the approximate current year tax rates
2 for this site would be \$3.2648/\$100.
- 3 (b) If the proposed development occurs and no deduction is granted, the approximate
4 current year tax rate for the site would be \$3.2648/\$100 (the change would be
5 negligible).
- 6 (c) If the proposed development occurs, the deduction schedule listed below in Section 7
7 is assumed and the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be
8 \$3.2648/\$100 (the change would be negligible).

9 **SECTION 6.** Pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, it is hereby determined that the deduction from
10 the assessed value of the hereinabove described real property shall be for a period of ten years.

11 **SECTION 7.** The deduction schedule from the assessed value of the real property
12 pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-17 shall look like this:

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18 **SECTION 8.** The benefits described in the Petitioner's Statement of Benefits can be
19 reasonably expected to result from the project and are sufficient to justify the applicable deductions.

20 **SECTION 9.** For real property, a deduction application must contain a performance report
21 showing the extent to which there has been compliance with the Statement of Benefits form
22 approved by the Fort Wayne Common Council at the time of filing. This report must be submitted
23 to the Allen County Auditor's Office, and the City of Fort Wayne's Community Development Division
24 and must be included with the deduction application. For subsequent years, the performance
25 report must be updated each year in which the deduction is applicable at the same time the property
26 owner is required to file a personal property tax return in the taxing district in which the property for
27 which the deduction was granted is located. If the taxpayer does not file a personal property tax
28 return in the taxing district in which the property is located, the information must be provided by
29 May 15.

30 **SECTION 10.** The performance report must contain the following information

A. The cost and description of real property improvements.

B. The number of employees retained and/or hired through the end of the preceding
calendar year as a result of the deduction.

1 C. The total salaries of the employees retained and/or hired through the end of the
2 preceding calendar year as a result of the deduction.

3 D. The total number of employees employed at the facility receiving the deduction.

4 E. The total assessed value of the real property deductions.

5 F. The tax savings resulting from the real property being abated.

6 **SECTION 11.** That, the taxpayer is non-delinquent on any and all property tax due to
jurisdictions within Allen County, Indiana.

7 **SECTION 12.** That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-12 et al, any property owner that has
8 received a deduction under section 3 or 4.5 of this chapter may be required to repay the deduction
9 amount as determined by the county auditor in accordance with section 12 of said chapter if the
10 property owner ceases operations at the facility for which the deduction was granted and if the
Common Council finds that the property owner obtained the deduction by intentionally providing
false information concerning the property owner's plans to continue operation at the facility.

11 **SECTION 13.** That, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its
12 passage and any and all necessary approval by the Mayor.
