
DECLARATORY RESOLUTION NO. R-____

A DECLARATORY RESOLUTION designating an "Economic Revitalization Area" under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1 for property commonly known as 7915 Decatur Road, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46816 (Arbors Indiana, LLC/Allied Argenta)

WHEREAS, Brightpoint ("Petitioner") has duly filed its petition dated February 19, 2025 to have the following described property designated and declared an "Economic Revitalization Area" under Sections 153.13-153.24 of the Municipal Code of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, to wit:

Attached hereto as "Exhibit A" as if a part herein; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$14,078,947; and

WHEREAS, it appears the said petition should be processed to final determination in accordance with the provisions of said Division 6.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That, subject to the requirements of Section 6, below, the property hereinabove described is hereby designated and declared an "Economic Revitalization Area" under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1. Said designation shall begin upon the effective date of the Confirming Resolution referred to in Section 6 of this Resolution and shall terminate on December 31, 2026, unless otherwise automatically extended in five year increments per I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-9.

SECTION 2. That, upon adoption of the Resolution:

- (a) Said Resolution shall be filed with the Allen County Assessor;
- (b) Said Resolution shall be referred to the Committee on Finance requesting a recommendation from said committee concerning the advisability of designating the above area an "Economic Revitalization Area";
- (c) Common Council shall publish notice in accordance with I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-2.5 and I.C. 5-3-1 of the adoption and substance of this resolution and setting this designation as an "Economic Revitalization Area" for public hearing.

SECTION 3. That, said designation of the hereinabove described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" shall apply to a deduction of the assessed value of real estate improvements to be made between May 1, 2025 and December 31, 2026. Should any delays occur, an updated timeframe will be communicated to the Allen County Assessor and Allen County Auditor by Community Development staff in writing.

SECTION 4. That, the estimate of the number of individuals that will be employed or whose employment will be retained and the estimate of the annual salaries of those individuals and the estimate of the value of redevelopment or rehabilitation, all contained in Petitioner's Statement of Benefits submitted to the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana ("City") are reasonable and are benefits

that can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed described redevelopment or rehabilitation.

SECTION 5. That, the current year approximate tax rates for taxing units within the City would be:

- (a) If the proposed development does not occur, the approximate current year tax rates for this site would be \$2.7587/\$100.
- (b) If the proposed development does occur and no deduction is granted, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.7587/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- (c) If the proposed development occurs, the deduction schedule listed below in Section 8 is assumed, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.7587/\$100 (the change would be negligible).

SECTION 6. That, this Resolution shall be subject to being confirmed, modified and confirmed, or rescinded after public hearing and receipt by Common Council of the above described recommendations and resolution, if applicable.

SECTION 7. That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, it is hereby determined that the deduction from the assessed value of the hereinabove described real property shall be for a period of ten years.

SECTION 8. The deduction schedule from the assessed value of the hereinabove described real property pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-17 shall be:

SECTION 9. That, the benefits described in the Petitioner's Statement of Benefits can be reasonably expected to result from the project and are sufficient to justify the applicable deductions.

SECTION 10. That, the taxpayer is non-delinquent on any and all property tax due to jurisdictions within Allen County, Indiana.

SECTION 11. That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-12 et al, any property owner that has received a deduction under section 3 or 4.5 of this chapter may be required to repay the deduction amount as determined by the county auditor in accordance with section 12 of said chapter if the

2	Common Council finds that the property owner obtained the deduction by intentionally providing

In order to be considered an Economic Revitalization Area (ERA), the area must be within the corporate limits of the City of Fort Wayne and must have become undesirable for, or impossible of, normal development and occupancy because of a lack of development, cessation of growth, deterioration of improvements or character of occupancy, age, obsolescence, substandard buildings, or other factors which have impaired values or prevent a normal development of property or use of property. It also includes any area where a facility or group of facilities that are technologically, economically, or energy obsolete is located and where the obsolescence may lead to a decline in employment and tax revenues.

How does the property for which you are requesting designation meet the above definition of an ERA? Property to be designated is a 214 unit income and age restricted affordable housing community with only 26 units currently habitable. Previous ownership incurred multiple Neighborhood Code building violations some requiring several weeks of fire watch by the FWFD due to non-functioning fire alarm systems. These structures have deteriorated to beyond a substandard level and if these improvements are not made critically needed affordable housing units will be lost.



Project Description

Arbors of South Towne Square Apartments ('Arbors') entails the acquisition and rehabilitation of an existing 214-unit multifamily elderly (62+) property built in 1974 and rehabilitated in 2007. 212 of the 214 (99%) units currently are under a HUD Housing Assistance Program ('HAP') contract.

The development offers several important benefits to the targeted population and local community:

- Provides 212 units of affordable housing for low-income to extremely low-income seniors
 (62+) in Fort Wayne, IN and the surrounding area;
- Revitalizes a blighted property with a challenging history of crime and dilapidating living conditions. The property is located within the Southeast neighborhood specifically targeted by the City for revitalization and redevelopment;
- Leverages scarce subsidy opportunities as this preserves 212 Section 8 vouchers through a HUD Housing Assistance Program contract.
- Offers residents quality, energy (LEED Silver equivalent) efficient efficiency- and 1bedroom units in addition to addressing extensive deferred maintenance and critical physical and systematic needs;
- Adds common areas and amenities such as community room, surveillance camera system, library, fitness room, BBQ & picnic area, dog park, and a local police substation;
- Free Wireless Internet (Wi-Fi) access in each unit and common areas;
- A low-barrier screening process and Eviction Prevention Plan;
- Connects residents with local partners providing needed services and additional amenities.

Development and Unit Description

Arbors Apartments was originally constructed in 1974. It consists of a mix of efficiency and 1-bedroom apartment units arranged in two three-story buildings on an 11-acre site. The development will have two offices, one in each building, community spaces such as a community room, library, video surveillance, elevators, free WiFi, on-site laundry facilities, and dog park and picnic area. The unit mix is as follows:

Arbors will meet the equivalent of a LEED Silver energy efficiency rating. All appliances, including dishwashers, will be energy efficient. Moreover, 5% of the units will be converted into ADA units, increasing options for those who need accessibility.

Target Resident Population/Area Needs

All units will be restricted to households with seniors (62+) at or below the 60% AMI threshold however with the existing and extended HUD HAP contract most residents will fall within the 30-50% AMI threshold. The property management agent will work closely in conjunction with local service providers to connect tenant households with the supportive services that best address their respective needs.

Based on discussions with multiple local agencies (including the agencies referenced above), the lack of affordable housing in the area, the negative reputation of this property and the area, and need for subsidized housing, is significant and troubling and virtually all local senior housing developments have very long waiting lists, some as long as a decade or more. Arbors will help alleviate these unmet demand and need to revitalize a property and an area that the Community is focused on turning around. The redevelopment of Arbors is an effort for Allied to be part of that team that helps improve opportunities for residents in the area, particularly low income seniors.

Neighborhood Revitalization

Arbors Apartments is within the Southeastern Fort Wayne, under the City of Fort Wayne's jurisdiction. It is in an area identified by the City as an area with critical need for reinvestment and across the street from a Neighborhood and projects selected by the Federal government as a Housing Choice Neighborhood. This area is surrounded by residential and commercial development, with quick access to services and amenities off Decatur Road such as schools, banks, restaurants, places of worship, retail, grocery stores, and medical centers.

The redevelopment will revitalize a property in need of substantial rehabilitation that has struggled with occupancy, operations and local reputation. The project will inject funds into the property and surround community that will tie to the City's vision of redeveloping this area, spurring and being part of additional residential and commercial development in the immediate vicinity. To demonstrate its support of the project and assist the team's credit application, the City of Fort Wayne is supporting the approval of a PILOT agreement to bring the acquisition and rehabilitation of this property a reality. Furthermore, this is an opportunity to preserve critical subsidy that is difficult to secure for low-income communities throughout the country.

The project qualifies for the following Location Efficient Points and Opportunity Index Points:

- Location Efficient Points for being in close proximity to the following: Walmart Supercenter, ALDI foods (grocery), Public Safety Academy (trade school), Precision Cuts (barber shop), Fifth Third Bank (bank), Planet fitness (gym), Smileworks Youth Dentistry (dentist), Community Harvest Food Bank, Wendy's, McDonalds.
- Transit-oriented points for Rural Transit: There is a bus stop .2 miles in front of the property.

- Opportunity Index Points:; Low unemployment Allen County 2.6% unemployment versus Indiana at 2.8% unemployment; Life expectancy greater than State (76.6 versus 76.5); Primary care to physicians 1,350:1
- Housing Need Index: Located in a county in high income in top quartile.

Effective Use of Resources

The development team will leverage a 4% RHTC/bond allocation with Affordable Workforce Housing Tax Credits and a Housing Assistance Project contract as well as a PILOT agreement from the City of Fort Wayne. Considering the financing schedule, we anticipate closing and starting construction around January 2025, with construction completion expected around April 2026, July 2026 stabilization.




The substantial rehabilitation of this project is currently estimated at \$72,000/unit.

Relocation



Due to the high number of vacancies at the Property, it is anticipated that most or all households will be able to be relocated on-site by directly transferring to a renovated unit. If additional units are needed in order to free up an entire stack at the Property, or if there are not sufficient vacancies available that meet a household's needs, households may be temporarily housed at a nearby hotel. A CONFIRMING RESOLUTION designating an "Economic Revitalization Area" under I.C. 6-1.1-12.1 for property commonly known as 2314 Decatur Road, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46816 (Arbors Indiana, LLC/Allied Argenta)

WHEREAS, Common Council has previously designated and declared by Declaratory Resolution the following described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" under Sections 153.13-153.24 of the Municipal Code of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, to wit:

Attached hereto as "Exhibit A" as if a part herein; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$14,078,947; and

WHEREAS, a recommendation has been received from the Committee on Finance; and

WHEREAS, notice of the adoption and substance of said Resolution has been published in accordance with I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-2.5 and I.C. 5-3-1 and a public hearing has been conducted on said Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That, the Resolution previously designating the above described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" is confirmed in all respects.

SECTION 2. That, the hereinabove described property is hereby declared an "Economic Revitalization Area" pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, said designation to begin on the effective date of this Resolution and shall terminate on December 31, 2026, unless otherwise automatically extended in five year increments per I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-9.

SECTION 3. That, said designation of the hereinabove described property as an "Economic Revitalization Area" shall apply to a deduction of the assessed value of real property improvements to be made between May 1, 2025 and December 31, 2026. Should any delays occur, an updated timeframe will be communicated to the Allen County Assessor and Allen County Auditor by Community Development staff in writing.

SECTION 4. That, the estimate of the number of individuals that will be employed or whose employment will be retained and the estimate of the annual salaries of those individuals and the estimate of the value of redevelopment or rehabilitation, all contained in Petitioner Arbors Indiana, LLC/Allied Argenta's ("Petitioner") Statement of Benefits submitted to the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana ("City") are reasonable and are benefits that can be reasonably expected to result from the proposed described redevelopment or rehabilitation.

SECTION 5. The current year approximate tax rates for taxing units within the City would be:

- (a) If the proposed development does not occur, the approximate current year tax rates for this site would be \$2.7587/\$100.
- (b) If the proposed development occurs and no deduction is granted, the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.7587/\$100 (the change would be negligible).
- (c) If the proposed development occurs, the deduction schedule listed below in Section 7 is assumed and the approximate current year tax rate for the site would be \$2.7587/\$100 (the change would be negligible).

SECTION 6. Pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1, it is hereby determined that the deduction from the assessed value of the hereinabove described real property shall be for a period of ten years.

SECTION 7. The deduction schedule from the assessed value of the real property pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-17 shall look like this:

SECTION 8. The benefits described in the Petitioner's Statement of Benefits can be reasonably expected to result from the project and are sufficient to justify the applicable deductions.

SECTION 9. For real property, a deduction application must contain a performance report showing the extent to which there has been compliance with the Statement of Benefits form approved by the Fort Wayne Common Council at the time of filing. This report must be submitted to the Allen County Auditor's Office, and the City of Fort Wayne's Community Development Division and must be included with the deduction application. For subsequent years, the performance report must be updated each year in which the deduction is applicable at the same time the property owner is required to file a personal property tax return in the taxing district in which the property for which the deduction was granted is located. If the taxpayer does not file a personal property tax return in the taxing district in which the property is located, the information must be provided by May 15.

SECTION 10. The performance report must contain the following information

- A. The cost and description of real property improvements.
- B. The number of employees retained and/or hired through the end of the preceding calendar year as a result of the deduction.
- C. The total salaries of the employees retained and/or hired through the end of the preceding calendar year as a result of the deduction.
- D. The total number of employees employed at the facility receiving the deduction.
- E. The total assessed value of the real property deductions.
- F. The tax savings resulting from the real property being abated.

SECTION 11. That, the taxpayer is non-delinquent on any and all property tax due to jurisdictions within Allen County, Indiana.

SECTION 12. That, pursuant to I.C. 6-1.1-12.1-12 et al, any property owner that has received a deduction under section 3 or 4.5 of this chapter may be required to repay the deduction amount as determined by the county auditor in accordance with section 12 of said chapter if the property owner ceases operations at the facility for which the deduction was granted and if the Common Council finds that the property owner obtained the deduction by intentionally providing false information concerning the property owner's plans to continue operation at the facility.

SECTION 13. That, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and any and all necessary approval by the Mayor.
