4 **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 39: ORDINANCE**
5 **VIOLATIONS BUREAU (39.03 SCHEDULE OF PENALTIES) OF**
6 **THE FORT WAYNE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ORDINANCES**

7 WHEREAS, The City of Fort Wayne has an extensive system of sidewalks
8 and trails; and

§ 39.05 FAILURE TO SATISFY CIVIL PENALTY, PROSECUTION.

If a person denies an ordinance or code violation under this procedure, fails to satisfy a civil penalty assessed by the Violations Clerk after having entered an admission of violation, or fails to appear to admit or deny the violation, then the

1 Violations Clerk shall report such fact to the office of the Corporation Counsel
2 who shall prosecute the ordinance violation cases on behalf of the city.
